2023 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage Media Accreditation Open

The <u>International Tennis Federation</u> (ITF) has announced today that the media accreditation process for the 2023 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage on 12-17 September is now open. The deadline for applications is Sunday 20 August.

The accreditation process will be conducted online. To apply for a media credential, please click the link below.

All credentials are in-person only, although media will also be able to access a Virtual Media Centre containing information, statistics, quotes and live scores from all four events.

You can request a credential for one of the following venues:

- · Bologna (Group A): Italy, Canada, Sweden, Chile
- Manchester (Group B): Great Britain, Australia, France, Switzerland
- · Valencia (Group C): Spain, Serbia, Czechia, Korea Rep.
- · Split (Group D): Croatia, USA, Netherlands, Finland

By submitting your accreditation request, you adhere to the following general conditions described below. Please read this information carefully before submitting your application and contact mediacredentials@daviscup.com if you have any questions.

- A separate application must be made by each journalist, photographer, radio reporter or TV non-rights holder representative wishing to cover the event.
- The submission of an application does not guarantee that a credential will be issued. Information regarding the status of each request will be sent to the e-mail address provided by the applicant. Each applicant will also receive an automatically generated message confirming that their application has been received and is being processed.
- Media credentials are processed by the ITF Communications team in agreement with the communications manager of the National Association of the applicant's country.
- Only applications from recognised media organisations will be considered.
- Applications from freelancers must include a letter from the Editor or Sports Editor of the publication or organisation for whom they will cover the event.
- Those considered for accreditation to the 2023 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage are daily national newspapers, Sunday newspapers, international wire services and news agencies, photo agencies, tennis/sports magazines, tennis/sports websites and radio and TV networks. Only local media from hosts cities will be considered.
- Information on requesting a radio booth is included in the accreditation process.

- TV non-rights holders: members of accredited ENG crews (journalist, producer, camera operator, editor) will be advised of any restrictions around access and filming. Only TV rights holders are entitled to film match footage. Failure to adhere to these conditions could result in the loss of a credential.
- Only media holding a valid TV accreditation are allowed to film/record moving images
- Credentials are not transferable.

The Group Stage events will be played in a round-robin format. The top two teams from each will advance to the 2023 Davis Cup Final 8 in Malaga, Spain on 21-26 November, where the eight best teams in the world will play in a knockout competition for the right to be crowned World Champion.
